for Rehabilitation offers an extensive array of outpatient programs, including physical, occupational and recreational therapies, speech and audiology, and aquatic therapy.

Two outpatient programs, designed for those with neurological conditions, are unique to northeast Ohio. The Neuro Day rehabilitation program provides

a continuum of care, including mobility and gait training, activities of daily living and medication management. The Parkinson’s disease comprehensive care program provides assessment, coping strategies, lifestyle changes and caregiver education. It is offered in partnership with Cleveland Clinic Center for Neurological Restoration. ■
